The North West

In the North West you will find the **Pennine Hills** and the Lake District National Park where you will find **Lake Windermere** and **Scafell Pike**: England's largest natural lake and tallest mountain.

The southern part of the North West region has a mix of **rural** and **urban** landscapes and contains many cities, towns and villages. The northern part of the North West region is mainly **rural**.

The River Mersey, River Derwent, River Irk, River Medlock and River Ribble are all found in this region. The Manchester Ship Canal links Manchester to Liverpool and the Irish Sea.

Regions

A **region** is a large area of land with a number of **counties** in it.

England is divided into 9 geographical **regions**.

These are **London, the South East, South West, East of England, East Midlands, West Midlands, Yorkshire and Humber, North East and the North West**.

The counties of **Greater Manchester, Cumbria, Lancashire, Cheshire and Merseyside** are found in the **North West** of England.

Each of these **counties** in the North West has its own **local government**.



The **North West** of England is the third most **populated** region of the United Kingdom after **London** and the **South East**.

Liverpool and Manchester are the North West's largest **settlements** as these are the two largest cities in the region.

Italy and its regions



Italy is a **country** in Europe which has a long Mediterranean **coastline**. Rome is its **capital city**. Italy is a **peninsula** – this means that it is largely surrounded by water with only some of its **border** being connected to the mainland.

There are 20 **regions** in Italy and **Campania** is a region in south-western Italy.

The **regional capital** of **Campania** is Naples. It has the highest **population** in the **region**.

Naples is one of Europe's **passenger ports** with approximately 6.5 million passengers traveling through the **port** each year.

It is a popular **tourist destination** because it is near the Amalfi coast where the **climate** is warm and there are lots of beaches.

Italy's **currency** is the Euro.



Campania is a **historical region** with many famous **landmarks** that are UNESCO World Heritage Sites. These include Naples, Pompeii and Herculaneum.

Campania is where pizza **originated**. Queen Margherita **inspired** the **creation** of this pizza. Raffaele Esposito, a pizza maker, was invited to create a pizza for Italian King Umberto I and his wife, Queen Margherita, in 1889. He created a straightforward pizza with fresh tomatoes, mozzarella cheese, and basil. The colors of these foods represent the Italian flag.

Campania is mountainous and hilly. The Apennine mountain range runs through this region. It has an active volcano called Mount Vesuvius. The areas around Mount Vesuvius are very fertile and they produce olive and fruit crops. They grow apricots, peaches, nuts, citrus and grapes.
